# Special points of interest:

## Mick Wilson 1923 - 2016

- **Replacement posts -**Pitch Place Green - In a bid to prevent further incursions onto the Green, the old wooden posts are to be replaced with 2ft tubular steel posts, backfilled with concrete. They will be powder coated green to minimize visual intrusion. The wooden gate will be replaced by three drop down posts.
- **Damaged bus shelter** - Entrance to Fairlands Estate - The missing pane of glass has finally been replaced. Total cost to the Parish Council £895 & VAT. The **Parish Council has** expressed its dissatisfaction at the considerable length of time it took the manufacturer of the bus shelter to replace the glass pane.
- Grass cutting A new three year contract has been awarded to Gavin Jones Ltd.

#### Local Plan - Targeted consultation to be carried out June/July 2017

Guildford Borough Council (GBC) has announced that it is now apparent the Local Plan would benefit from a number of changes that go beyond being minor in nature. The Planning Inspectorate has recommended that these proposed amendments are subject to a further targeted Regulation 19 consultation. The draft document and both sets of Regulation 19 representations will then be submitted to the Secretary of State (SoS).

The purpose of the targeted consultation is not to repeat the initial Regulation 19 consultation but to seek representations that only relate to the subsequent changes made to the draft document following the 2016 consultation. These changes will be made clear within the new consultation document. The consultation will also relate to changes to the evidence base since the last consultation, namely the addendum to the Strategic Housing Market Assessment (SHMA), the Employment Land Needs Assessment and the Retail and Leisure Needs Assessment, the Travellers Accommodation Assessment and the Water Quality Assessment. This additional stage of consultation will result in a delay of one year to the previously agreed timetable for all documents within the Local Development Scheme (LDS).

If applicable, the Parish Council will respond to the targeted consultation which will be taking place in June/ July 2017.

#### Phone kiosks to be adopted by the Parish Council -Local community to be responsible for the restoration and upkeep

In October 2016 BT announced its intentions to remove two of the last remaining iconic K6 phone kiosks from the Parish.

The K6 phone box was designed by Sir Giles Gilbert Scott to commemorate the Silver Jubilee of the coronation of King

#### Russell Place Farm -Planning Application No: 16/P/02134

On 25 January 2017 the Borough Council's Planning Committee refused the planning application for 82 acres of working farmland to be turned into a SANG (Suitable Alternative Natural Green Space)/ Nature Reserve.

The applicant has the right of appeal.

#### Improved safety surfacing beneath play equipment and bouncy seat

The safety matting underneath various pieces of equipment is to be replaced, in the near future, with wetpour a far more durable surface.

The area beneath the bouncy seat on Wood Street Green will be coloured green to blend in with the Conservation Area. the kiosks at the sum of £1 each.

Local residents will restore the kiosks and will be responsible for their maintenance/ upkeep. Future use of the kiosks will be decided by the communities involved.

#### New litter bins to be installed in the Worplesdon Memorial Grounds

The Parish Council still believes that keeping the parish clean and tidy is something for which we should all continue to strive, therefore two new litter bins are to be installed in the Worplesdon Memorial Ground.

Fairwood Helpers is a local Charity and Good Neighbour Group, serving Fairlands, Wood Street Village and Worplesdon (Perry Hill). It is run entirely by volunteers.

Volunteers mainly drive clients to hospitals, doctor's surgeries, dentist's surgeries, hairdressers and supermarkets.

As a charity they rely on donations from clients to cover their costs based on 45p per mile which is recommended by the Surrey Community Care Scheme. Many of their volunteers kindly do not claim expenses as a result of which they usually have surplus funds which they put back into the
