Welcome to the 43rd edition of our newsletter designed to keep you up to date with what happening in the parish.

Special points of interest:

- **Wood Street Summer Show Saturday 15 July 2pm** - All are welcome.
- **Maintenance of the flower borders Fairlands Ave** - These will be weeded on a monthly trial basis throughout the growing season.
- **Adopted phone kiosks** - The Parish Council wishes to extend its thanks to SCC for the £400 grant towards the restoration costs and to the Volunteers who will soon restore these iconic heritage landmarks to their former glory.
- **Sale of Burpham Court Farm** - The farmstead buildings are being sold off by Guildford Borough Council for residential use. There are plans to turn the farmland into a Wetland Reserve.

Due to a reduction in the funding provided to Surrey Wildlife Trust by Surrey County Council towards the upkeep of the Countryside Estate Surrey Wildlife Trust's Countryside Team has had to undergo a major restructure.

The role of Ranger has been made redundant.

The new Countryside Team now comprises:

Leigh Thornton - Estate Manager, three Practical Volunteer Leaders - Jon Gardner, Ross Packman

Whilst the Parish Council paid for new posts to be installed along Pitch Place Green, the lockable bollards had regrettably not been secured - albeit the gate was chained and padlocked shut. Unfortunately, the chain was cut and forcible entry gained. To prevent further

The Parish Council will continue to work in partnership with Surrey Wildlife Trust in a bid to keep the various commons across Worplesdon in good order.

Ward Improvements

Over recent weeks a number of improvements have been carried out in mostly in Wood Street Village. These include repainting the Maypole, introducing new land drains into the Village Green to help resolve flooding issues. We would like to thank Guildford Borough Council for its grant of £5,200 towards the land drainage work.

The village sign is being renovated by Terrence Clark, our local and very talented Artist Blacksmith, overgrowth has been removed from and around the village pond and the ditch beside Nightingale Old Farm has been re-dug.

New safety surfacing has been introduced in the Worplesdon Play Area. New ropes will soon be fitted to the "Typhoon".

A new path is to be laid in the Fairlands Play Area and the safety surfacing beneath the bouncy seat on Wood Street Village Green is also to be replaced.

Surrey County Council is to undertake ditch maintenance along the Aldershot Road between "Dalmead" and the entrance to Fair Oaks after the bird nesting season.

Harry's Meadow - Jacobs Well

A grant of £500 has been awarded to the Wood Street Village Association to provide new gazebos for the Summer Show.

The Jacobs Well Residents' Association (JWRA) has asked the Parish Council to widen the use of Harry's Meadow, which is predominantly used by dog walkers.

Various suggestions were put forward. The Parish Council is considering the

following options:

- The installation of adult exercise equipment.
- The introduction of a wildflower meadow.
- The installation of benches & litter bin.

It is the Parish Council's intention to seek funding

for the adult exercise equipment and sponsorship for the wildflower meadow and benches.

Nevins Copse - Named after the late Cllr Mike Nevins

Volunteers for the Parish council have been working to clear Nevin's Copse at the top of Pinks Hill of dense undergrowth and entangled trees for several years. The objective being to restore this to a pleasant woodland with open spaces which can be enjoyed by our residents as well as providing a habitat for

species and a wildlife corridor for animals traversing the commons. What was once a virtually impenetrable

indigenous jungle, due to it being left to grow wild for more than forty years, is now slowly turning into a haven of peace, dappled shade and tranquillity.

Rhoda Nevins, the former Chairman of Pirbright Parish Council, came to see the progress being made in the Copse,

named after her late husband Mike, a former County Councillor for Worplesdon. We will now concentrate on clearing invasive Laurel and bramble and hope to open up the old ditch which partly surrounds the site to improve drainage and access.

Public rights of Way

Maintenance of the public rights of way network in Surrey is undertaken by the County Council's Country-side Access Team. The County Council faces unprecedented financial challenges, as a result of which further budget reductions will be required. This will cause significant challenges in meeting its statutory duties, ensuring public

safety and keeping paths open. Enforcement work will continue as normal as will dealing with planning matters and working to deliver schemes where external funding has been obtained.

Maintenance will however be significantly reduced. In future if a surface cannot be made safe then a closure may be necessary to protect

people from harm.

With the assistance of the County Council it may be possible to establish a volunteer work scheme if there is sufficient local interest.

Bridge strikes - Salt Box Road

The Parish Council has been liaising with Surrey County Council, the Rt. Hon. Anne Milton MP and Network Rail regarding the increasing number of bridge strikes and associated problems experienced when over-height vehicles use Salt Box Road.

Network Rail has given its assurances that the bridge is structurally sound and that visible damage is purely cosmetic.

Devolved services - Additional costs to WPC

Due to the escalating cost of Adult Social Care, Surrey County is having to cut its expenditure in all departments. The County Council is therefore looking to the Town and Parish Councils to assist in terms of the discretionary services the County

Council provides e.g. grass cutting, maintenance of public rights of way, overhanging vegetation etc.

The Parish Council is therefore incurring additional costs on behalf of local residents to ensure that no drop in service occurs.

This year the Parish Council is paying for an additional cut along Salt Box Road, for pedestrian safety and will also meet the cost of siding out footpaths and cutting back vegetation as necessary despite the loss of and reduction in various grants towards this work.
