Potholes, pavements, blocked and broken drains, flooding, fallen trees and overgrown vegetation, can be reported **directly** to **Surrey County Council**.

This can be done <u>online</u>, or if you consider a problem to be an immediate threat to life or limb, or do not have internet access, call their Contact Centre on **0300 200 1003**.

The same applies to crimes or anti-social behaviour. Please report incidents directly to Surrey Police on 101 or via their <u>website</u> (if non-urgent) and 999 (if urgent).

Groundsman's Update

Peter, the Head Groundsman, has continued to deal with a multitude of issues across the parish, in addition to his regular checks and ongoing annual maintenance schedule.

Rubbish continues to be thrown from vehicles, which can end up blocking the flow of rainwater into the drains and watercourses. The Groundsman continues to litter pick at hotspots during the course of his 'rounds', even on land which is neither owned nor maintained by Worplesdon Parish Council.

Amongst the many issues that have been resolved recently were tree branches that had fallen, blocking the sightlines on the roundabout at Fairlands, were made safe by the Groundsman. It was also heartening to see that when a tree recently fell across the road at Oak Hill (Wood Street Village), the local community and affected motorists worked together, donned high-vis vests, and cleared the road rapidly, to keep this important route open.

May we use this opportunity to remind residents that the Head Groundsman is employed on a part-time basis, and whilst the parish council appreciates being informed about issues, it can be more expedient to report issues directly to the correct authority—i.e. the trees on Fairlands roundabout are the responsibility of Surrey County Council.

Peter is happy for residents to approach him about issues that are concerning them, whilst he is out and about in the liveried parish vehicle. The children from Wood Street Village Infant School regular highlight issues to him, such as fly tips, or other anti-social activities!





The Parish Council has continued to deploy Community SpeedWatch teams to carry out one-hour long deployments, at seven key locations, across the whole parish. Worplesdon Community SpeedWatch is part of a significantly wider initiative, supported by an ever increasing number of police forces across the whole of England.

Litter Picking

Lots of residents continue to litter pick in and around their properties, for which the parish council would like to extend their grateful thanks. The Parish Council has invested in some litter pickers and hoops, including some litter pickers for children, to allow organised litter picks at locations which are attracting significant volumes of rubbish. If any groups wish to borrow the equipment, such as to take part in Keep Britain Tidy initiatives, or even just more local litter picks, please contact <u>Victoria</u> (Assistant Clerk) to organise collection and return.

Blue Heart Scheme

Surrey County Council are actively supporting the BLUE Campaign - <u>https://bluecampaignhub.com/councils</u>, which is a collaboration with PLANTLIFE. This campaign is a simple, but effective action, to turn roadside verges into native flower meadows. No wildflower seeds are required, just minimal cutting.



Worplesdon Parish Council encourages all residents to read more on this scheme, and to follow Surrey County Council's progress.

Resident's Survey 2021

This year's Resident's Survey is ready to 'go live'! As most residents will remember, similar surveys have been undertaken previously in both 2017 and 2019. The survey focuses on matters which are of relevance to the parish.

St Mary the Virgin Church at Perry Hill, and the Sime Gallery (located at Worplesdon Memorial Hall) take part, but there are also nearby events, just outside of the parish, at Wanborough (including the Great Barn of Wanborough, and The Church of St Bartholomew), Puttenham Barn Bunkhouse (which has over 250 years of history), Prior's Field School, and

Guildford Cathedral, without including the multitude of events and properties in the town centre who also take part.

Worplesdon Memorial Hall and Recreation Ground

Worplesdon Memorial Hall and Recreation Ground will be celebrating their centenary between 14 and 16 October 2022. The land was gifted by Sir James Walker, and together with monies from Sir Laurence Halsey KBE, this allowed the building of the hall as a memorial to those who died in the Great War. The Women's Institute were the first users, and they still meet at the hall 100 years later. The Parish Council lease an area in the grounds to provide a popular children's play area. The Worplesdon Recreation Ground is also home to wellestablished football, cricket, and tennis clubs.

Many events have been held in the hall over the last 100 years, and the trustees would welcome your photos, stories, or memories as they prepare for the weekend of celebrations. It is hoped that lots of residents will join them in October 2022 to celebrate. As part of the celebrations the memorial hall will be producing a booklet encompassing the 100 years of history.
