Groundsperson Vacancy - 16 hrs per week

We are recruiting a part-time Groundsperson to join our busy team! Local Council Salary Scale (SCP 7 – 12) - Starting salary £11.84ph (initially 16 hours per week with the potential for increased hours in time) 23 days annual leave (pro-rata), plus bank holidays & two statutory days, and membership of the Local Government Pension Scheme

We require a team member to join us to carry out repairs and maintenance to council property and facilities, supporting the Head Groundsman with the day-to-day maintenance of Parish Council play areas and public open spaces, ensuring we provide a high standard of maintenance across all Parish Council assets. In this role, you will carry out a wide range of repairs and maintenance to council property and facilities, minor repairs to play area equipment, various open spaces fixtures, fittings, and furniture. Working outside in all weather is a key part of this role. You will also carry out grounds' maintenance works on open spaces managed by the Parish Council, including grass cutting, litter picking.

Ideally you will have experience in carrying out DIY maintenance work to a high standard, knowledge of power tools, the ability to solve basic maintenance issues, and the ability to undertake heavy manual work. Training will be provided, as well as appropriate PPE.

Reporting to the Head Groundsman, the position is available for 16 hours a week (8:30 until 16:30 on Wednesday and Friday).

This year, Challengers have been able to build a new playground featuring special equipment including: a Brooklands-inspired circuit to run around, sloping hills for rolling, and a large sandpit to provide endless fun and games. Play Area Vandalism

Sadly the play area in Jacobs Well was vandalised just a few days into the Summer holidays. The damage, which was most likely caused by a bladed article, was discovered on three different decks on the wooden multi-play unit. The replacement decks will cost over £1,000 to supply and fit.

Meeting with MECA

The Parish Council were very pleased to be invited to meet the committee of the Guildford Central Mosque at Rickford Hill. It was really interesting to hear how

the mosque committee have been doing everything reasonably possible to keep local neighbours happy whilst welcoming worshippers to the premises. The committee are happy to answer any questions locals may have.



Play Area Consultation

The Parish Council will shortly be consulting on the play equipment located at the at Worplesdon Memorial Hall and Grounds. We would like to replace the current swing frames, and both install new and replace some of the bow top fencing. At the same time, we would also like to upgrade the thermoplastic surface marking in the ball games area, replace the basket swing seat, and try to replace the whizzers. To complete all of these works, we would need to secure grant funding. A condition of the grant funding is to be able to evidence that we have community support for the project. Without community support we would not be able to access certain grant funds.

A QR code will be displayed on posters at the play area to gauge usage, how far people come to use the play area, and which of the facilities they like the most, together with the opportunity to feedback any additional comments about the play facilities.

Speeding Traffic

Community SpeedWatch (CSW) and the Speed Data Recorder (SDR) continue to be deployed around the parish. The SDR can be deployed to directly respond to the concerns of residents relating to not just the speed of vehicles but also the size of vehicles using particular roads.

The data accumulated from a number of locations will be used to lobby Surrey Police and Surrey County Council.

Tree Surgery

Sadly, due to a combination of age and disease, together with the impact of the weather extremes we've experienced, a significant amount of tree works need to be undertaken across the majority of council maintained sites.

Oak Processionary Moth nests have been spotted at two locations during our annual tree inspection survey and a specialist contractor has been engaged to remove them.

To offset the ongoing deterioration of trees the parish council intends to plant a significant number of additional trees in the form of succession planting starting in Autumn 2023.



Poisonous Plants

Since Covid people have been spending more time out and about in the parish, and in their gardens too!

It might be that there's a plant you've spotted which you think that you can positively identify... but there's a possibility that you might have been mistaken and misidentified the plant.

A number of potentially poisonous plants look very similar to harmless plants, such as cow parsley (harmless) and hemlock (poisonous).

Hemlock has purple spots on the stem (although young hemlock's spots are quite feint), and the stems are hairless. When snapped the stems have an unpleasant chemical-type smell. Cow parsley stems are hairy (and sometime ribbed) and rigid. Cow parsley has a mild parsley smell.

Work Parties

The Parish Council have reinstated work parties across the parish. These work parties have allowed us to target specific issues at a number of locations. The first was at Worplesdon Memorial Hall and Grounds play area and involved a comprehensive clean of the play equipment, edging of the wetpour to allow long-awaited wetpour repairs to take place, and a few dirty road signs were also cleaned at the same time!

The second work party was at Jacobs Well Recreation Ground. This was to top-dress some significant trip hazards that had formed in an area near the football goals which was now being used by the newly formed

No 17 Bus Service

Surrey County Council (SCC) has agreed to expand the electric minibus service, which it will run directly (paid for by SCC from Surrey Council Tax to support rural areas). The SCC replacement for the 17 bus service (serving Wood Street Village and Fairlands) will be the new "Surrey Connect" service with electric minibuses, starting on 2nd September 2023. This is a change of concept, as there is no "route" and no timetable for a direct response bus service . Residents can book journeys when they wish to travel.

The Surrey Connect service will operate Monday to Friday 7am to 7pm, and Saturday 8am to 6pm.

Details will be publicised shortly, so please keep an eye out on social media, our website, and our noticeboards. You will catch the bus, from bus stops, to go to destinations throughout the Central Guildford area.

This change does **NOT** affect any other current local bus services such as the Route 20 bus (previously called KITE) or the 520 bus, both run by Stagecoach.

United Reformed Church

The recently installed bench at Perry Hill Green was installed following the URC Diocese's decision to close the Worplesdon United Reformed Church premises.

The bench has a plaque, generously paid for by a local resident whose family have longstanding links to the immediate locality and the United Reformed Church. A disc has been commissioned which contains a QR code linking to the Parish Council's website and specifically lists the historical links between the Green and the United Reformed Church. The disc will shortly be fixed to the bench.
