Hornbeam Lucas	Upright	Columnar deciduous tree about 8m in height when mature, broadening with age. Bright-green foliage in spring and summer, turns a rich golden yellow in autumn, the dead brown leaves are retained through winter. Field maple Elsrijk	Compact and upright	A Dutch selection of the field maple with a neater, dense conical shaped crown making it ideal as a street tree. Lime		T. cordata is a medium-sized deciduous tree with a spreading or rounded crown, and glossy dark green, heart-shaped leaves to 8cm in length, turning yellow in autumn. Liquidambar Worplesdon	Bushy	A deciduous tree with a branching pyramidal habit, growing to about 20m tall. Deeply divided, maple-like, rich green leaves with long narrow lobes, turn to shades of orange and yellow in autumn. Insignificant late spring flowers are reliably followed by spiky fruit capsules in autumn. Standard hornbeam	Bushy	A large deciduous tree developing a fluted grey trunk. Leaves 5-8cm long, ovate, conspicuously ribbed, turning yellow in autumn. Sheerwater Seedling rowan	Columnar upright - Lots of red berries	Sheerwater Seedling' is a medium-sized cultivar with an upright habit; the branches ascending to form an oval shaped crown. Cherry Sunset boulevard	Compact head - pink-white flower - not a spreader	The large, single white flowers are tinged with pink at the edges, giving a pretty soft colour to them which contrasts nicely with the emerging coppery foliage. The flowers are held on the tree in pairs, maximising their impact and are held on the tree for longer than many other cherries. As the summer progresses the coppery foliage turns to green and then golden yellow in the autumn time. The leaves are elliptical and medium sized for a cherry. Initially bred to be an extremely columnar tree, this cherry does broaden with age to a more oval shape. This tree prefers a well drained soil and will not enjoy having wet feet. Widely introduced and used as a street tree in the UK owing to its compact and tidy shaped crown. Pyrus Chanticleer	Ornamental pear	Chanticleer' is a narrowly conical medium-sized deciduous tree with glossy dark green ovate leaves, usually colouring well in autumn. Metasequoia Glyptostroboides	Columnar upright	A vigorous, fast-growing conifer with fibrous, orange-brown bark, making a large, narrowly conical tree to 25m tall. Soft, bright green leaflets are held in two opposite ranks, giving the leaves a feathery appearance. Unusually for a conifer, this species is deciduous and the foliage takes on a tawny brown colour before dropping in autumn. Hawthorn	Bushy	Rounded deciduous tree to about 10m in height, with thorny branches and glossy, deeply lobed dark green leaves, colouring gold in autumn. For comparison:

Horse Chestnut trees can mature to heights in excess of 30m, with a width between 12 - 18m, and can live up to 300 years. They are non-native.

Red dots on the accompanying maps show the proposed locations of trees to be planted this Autumn (2023). Those annotated to be planted for the Coronation (with associated tree plaques) exclude the Liquidambar 'Worplesdon' tree already planted to commemorate the occasion at Pitch Place Green.
