New Groundsperson

We are very pleased to welcome a member to our small but dedicated team. Local resident Andy Connor, will be joining Peter Trevena to inspect and maintain Parish Council assets across the parish in play areas and on land we're responsible for, as well as addressing flooding hotspots, where applicable.

Andy is an enthusiastic gardener and enjoys walking his dog around the parish. He is really looking forward to finding out more about the parish, discovering some of the 'hidden' gem

locations which are dotted around the parish, and

meeting the residents! Please do say 'hello' to him when you spot him out and about!

The only full-time member of staff is the Clerk to the Council, Gaynor White, whilst the other members of staff are all part-time.



Provision of Christmas Lights

For a number of years Worplesdon Parish Council has utilised monies from the precept (which is collected through your council tax payment) to pay for two illuminated Christmas trees - one at St Mary's Church, Perry Hill and the other on Wood Street Village Green - together with illuminating a number of the horse chestnuts alongside Perry Hill Green on Worplesdon Road, opposite the former White Lyon and Dragon.

The contract will soon be due for re-tendering and we'd like to consult with residents to find out what residents would really like from the lights - or even if they want them at all! In recent years, due to horse chestnut canker and general tree maintenance, there have been numerous instances where the horse chestnut

trees at Perry Hill Green have had to have the lights removed to have tree works undertaken. This incurs an additional cost. These works are unavoidable.

The existing Christmas lights are already commercial LED lights, so are more energy efficient, and the electricity charges for the current lights on Perry Hill Green are in the region of £250 annually. The church pay for the electricity for the lights at St Mary's Church, and the lights on Wood Street Village Green are paid for by the village association.

<u>Challengers</u>

The Parish Council were very pleased to be invited to attend the opening of the new Challengers play area at their Stoke Park facility on 5 October 2023. Challengers work is greatly appreciated through their provision of truly inclusive fun and safe places where disabled children and young people can spend time with their friends. This offers a positive impact for not just the families, but the wider community.

The Parish Council is pleased to support Challengers through the use of Wood Street Village Green for their incredibly successful jazz festival held annually in July. In Summer 2023 the event raised over £22,000. The new playground features special equipment including a We-Go-Swing which will reduce the social isolation of disabled children. Riparian Ownership & Flooding

Please can we reiterate to residents the importance of clearing out the ditches and streambanks you are responsible for. Whilst you might not be experiencing flooding at your location, the implications of your watercourse not being clear might be inadvertently causing flooding elsewhere. When clearing vegetation, please don't be tempted to put it into the water hoping the water will take it away; it will simply block a grille downstream. Thank you.

Silverbirch Care Home

The Clerk and Assistant Clerk were invited to have a sneak preview of the exceptional facilities at the new care home located within the Keens Lane development. They received a very warm welcome from the Manager

of the home, Louise, and the home's Home Services Advisor, Sally-Anne.

The home hosts 'cake and a cuppa' afternoons on Wednesdays from 2pm to 4pm to help combat loneliness. All are welcome.



Play Area Consultation

The Parish Council has recently consulted on the play equipment located at Worplesdon Memorial Hall and Grounds. The feedback was very interesting and we would like to thank all those play area users who provided feedback on the existing equipment and the potential options available for upgrade.

The results of the feedback will be available shortly on our website.

Some of the issues highlighted in the feedback are beyond the control of the parish council, such as the holes in the football field, and the location of benches which are not within the play areas.

As a result of the feedback, we will soon be submitting an application for grant funding to undertake upgrading works to this well used and highly regarded play area.

Speeding Traffic

Community SpeedWatch (CSW) and the Speed Data Recorder (SDR) continue to be deployed around the parish. The SDR is deployed to directly respond to the concerns of residents relating to not just the speed of vehicles but also the size of vehicles using particular roads. The data (which does **NOT** include any vehicle numberplate information) accumulated from a number of locations will be used to lobby Surrey Police and Surrey County Council.

Tree Surgery

Due to a combination of age and disease, together with the ongoing impact of the weather extremes experienced, more tree surgery is being undertaken by specialist contractors at some of the Parish Council maintained sites.

To offset the impact of the tree surgery, together with our focus on enhancing the local levels of tree stocks, we will be planting 420 whips at Nevins Copse, Pinks Hill, Wood Street Village. The Parish Council continues to subscribe to the 'right tree, right place' ethos.

This planting is in addition to a number of additional trees which will be planted as succession planting starting in December 2023 - as well as the trees for the Coronation.

Surrey Connect Bus Service

The SCC replacement for the 17 bus service (serving Wood Street Village and Fairlands) is the "Surrey Connect" service. Populated with electric minibuses which are regularly spotted around and about the parish! There is no defined "route" and no timetable for a direct response bus service. Residents can book journeys when they wish to travel between the operating hours of Monday to Friday 7am to 7pm, and Saturday 8am to 6pm. Details have been publicised and a brochure should have been delivered to each house in the area the bus operates. If you, or a neighbour without internet access, require a paper copy of the brochure, please contact the Parish Office: 01483 300094.

The bus still stops at designated bus stops and goes to destinations throughout the Central Guildford area.
