Cllr Gordon Adam - 1958 to 2025



The Parish Council is deeply saddened to notify residents of the sudden death of Councillor Gordon Adam.

Gordon's journey with the Parish Council began in 2014, when he joined as a community member of the Parish Council's Traffic Committee.

From the very outset, his dedication to the well-being of our community was evident to all who worked with him. His insight, his passion, and his tireless commitment quickly became invaluable assets to the Council.

In May 2022, Gordon was elected Vice-Chairman of the Parish Council, a role he served with distinction for the past three years. He also chaired the Staffing Committee for five years, providing steady guidance, sound judgement, and always a friendly listening ear.

Beyond these key roles, Gordon represented the Council on several important local organisations, including the Slyfield Area Regeneration Plan, the Fairlands, Liddington Hall and Gravetts Lane Community Association, and the Worplesdon Memorial Trustees – where, in 2021, he was elected Chairman, serving until his resignation in 2024.

Gordon's contributions to our community cannot be measured by titles or positions alone. What truly set him apart was his effervescent personality, his kindness, his boundless enthusiasm for life, and his remarkable ability to connect with everyone he met.

He was, in every sense, a largerthan-life character, and his absence is deeply felt- not just within the Council chambers, but throughout the community he served so wholeheartedly.

Gordon leaves behind a legacy of service, friendship, and community spirit. His contributions will not be forgotten, and his memory will continue to inspire us in the work we do.

Potholes, pavements, blocked and broken drains, flooding, fallen trees and overgrown vegetation can be reported directly to <u>Surrey County</u> <u>Council (www.surreycc.gov.uk)</u>. This can be done online, or if you consider a problem to be an immediate threat to life or limb, or do not have internet access, call the Contact Centre on 0300 200 1003.

To report **crimes** or **anti-social behaviour** do this directly to **Surrey Police** on **101** or via their **website** (if non-urgent) and **999** (if urgent).

Thames Water can be contacted on 0800 316 9800 for sewage flooding.

Flooding on highways and footpaths should be reported to Surrey County Council on 0300 200 1003 or using https://tellus.surreycc.gov.uk/.

Fly-tipping on public highways or council land will be dealt with by **Guildford Borough Council**: www.guildford.gov.uk/reportflytipping.

Volunteering opportunities

Each village has a team of hard-working volunteers diligently working throughout the year to litter pick, organise fairs, maypole dancing, cricket matches, Macmillan coffee mornings, and lunches for the elderly but none of these can go ahead without people volunteering.

Even if you can spare just an hour of your time it can make a difference.

Do you have some spare time to be a Fairwood Helper?

Fairwood Helpers is a Good Neighbour Group helping residents with transport and other needs such as form-filling. They currently cover residents in: Fairlands, Wood Street Village, Perry Hill, Liddington Hall, and Gravetts Lane.

In August 2024 Fairwood Helpers had to reduce their phone line hours due to a lack of volunteers to staff the phones. Fairwood Helpers are in particular need of Duty Officers to staff the phone lines as this role is continually being performed by a small cadre of people. You do not have to be a Driver to be a Fairwood Helpers Volunteer! Similarly, you don't have to be a Duty Officer either and if there are any residents seeking low demand voluntary work who have Financial, IT, or Admin skills please contact as they'd like to build up resilience in these areas.
